

History

October 2000

 At the 3rd Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM3) in Seoul, the European Commission (EC), Singapore and Korea jointly proposed the Trans-Eurasia Information Network (TEIN) Project and it was adopted as one of new ASEM projects.

December 2001

•The 1st TEIN network was launched as the 2Mbps link between RENATER of France and KOREN of Korea.

January 2004

 The European Union (EU) announced to commit a substantial amount of contribution for the continuity of TEIN Initiative (TEIN2) until the end of 2007.

September 2006

TEIN2 was launched officially at ASEM6 in Helsinki.

January 2007

•The 1st proposal of TEIN Organization was reported in the 12th TEIN2 Technical Committee Meeting in Manila.

December 2007

•TEIN3 contract has been signed between EU/EC and DANTE.

October 2008

 In ASEM7, leaders recognized the success of the TEIN in fostering research collaboration between all ASEM partners, welcomed the launch of TEIN3 and renewed their commitment to its long-term sustainability.



February 2010

 In the 4th TEIN3 Technical Committee meeting in Sydney, Korea formally proposed to establish the "TEIN* Cooperation Center" in Korea as a non-profit organization under the supervision of ASEM.

October 2010

•The 4th phase of the TEIN project (TEIN4) and the TEIN* Cooperation Center received endorsement from the ASEM8 Summit in Brussels.

August 2011

•TEIN* Cooperation Center has been legally registered under the Korean Civil Law as a non-profit foundation corporation.

April 2012

* TEIN4 contract was signed between EU/EC and TEIN*CC.

Our Objectives

- To contribute to the MDGs[Millennium Development Goals] and the regional development through TEIN4 network in the Asia-Pacific region and Europe.
- To further develop dedicated highspeed Internet links between national R&E organizations in Asia and connect them with Europe.



- To promote the broadening of MDG relevant user applications made available by the TEIN network, and increase the use of the TEIN network.
- •To enhance human capacity of the TEIN4 beneficiary partners and promote international R&E collaboration between Asian and European partners.

Work Package

WP1: Network Procurement and Commercial Management

- Conducting the TEIN4 connectivity tender
- Reviewing the network to increase network capacities
- •Setting up TEIN network operational policies and overseeing the TEIN4 NOC
- Setting up and overseeing operational agreements with partners and other networks to provide backup and resilience in the event of problems
- Conducting a feasibility study with the intention of developing plans to extend the network to further Asian countries such as Afghanistan, the Maldives, Mongolia and Myanmar.



WP2: Promoting and Supporting Applications

- Developing a portfolio of target applications areas for TEIN4 support
- Seeking to further develop or extend user applications with social benefits through the promotion of such applications to user communities and government decision makers
- Setting up a TEIN4 user support group for partners to co-ordinate applications support and share best practice
- Developing an applications database to monitor and help matchmake TEIN4 users and applications
- Focusing TEIN4 dissemination activities on raising user awareness, including amongst other European research programs (e.g. the EC's Seventh Framework Program on Research and Development)









WP3: Enhancing Human Capacity and International Collaboration

- Commissioning and delivering customized training courses or network engineering and operations for beneficiary partners' staff
- Providing funding support, subject to budget availability, for beneficiary partners' staff capacity development e.g. "on the jot training" with other partners
- Assessing needs for non-technical training by beneficiary partners
 e.g. financial administration and tendering
- •Enhancing the cooperation with other parties in facilitating R&E developments in Asia (e.g. APAN (Asia-Pacific Advanced Network) ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations), World Bank and NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization)
